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"MOVING TOWARDS THE END-TIME WARS"

Most of us would admit that we knew that the war in Iraq was coming. It seemed almost inevitable. Yet the quick commencement of hostilities following President Bush's 48hour ultimatum to

Saddam Hussein still caught many off guard.

War is indeed a terrible thing, but it is also a fact of life. Jesus said to his disciples when asked about signs of the end-times and His return: "And you shall hear of wars and rumors of wars: see that you be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass. . . All these are the beginning of sorrows" (Matt. 24:6,8).

As patriotic Americans, we stand behind our Commander in Chief and our brave troops who have fought so heroically to remove a tyrannical dictator from power and to reduce the chances that weapons of mass destruction could be used against us. I believe we are also standing up as a protector of Israel, honoring the admonition of Scripture to "Pray for the peace of Jerusalem: they shall prosper that love you" (Ps. 122:6).

We pray for the safety of our troops, for their victory in battle, for the innocent civilians whose lives we hope to liberate from oppression, and for the souls of all who need to be liberated from the bonds of sin by coming to faith in Jesus Christ.

The Power of the Press

Early on in the war, a number of things became apparent.

1. The power of the American press to mold opinion. At the inception of broadcast news in America, there was a commitment to present the news without bias – to offer the facts clearly and objectively so that the public could

draw its own conclusions. Over the years, the line between reporting and editorializing became blurred, with some notable exceptions. People no longer seem to be able to differentiate between fact and opinion. Instead, they interview each other about their feelings and opinions and call it news. That is a great disservice to the public. In the war with Iraq, news reporting hit at the same time new highs and new lows. Many journalists showed their true colors. Some have gained new respect in our eyes.

2. The power of the foreign press to inflame the masses. It is a well-known fact that many foreign news organizations do not hold the commitment to objectivity that the American press is **supposed** to have. Especially in less-than-free states, the press has always been openly used as a propaganda tool. In Hitler's Germany, the state press whipped public emotions to a frenzy. The same was true of the Soviet press, that of Communist regimes in China, Cuba, and more.

The continued and ludicrous assertion by the Iraqi Ministry of Information that Iraq has massacred our troops at Saddam International Airport, added to their denials that American troops were in Baghdad, further illustrated this point. Obviously the Iraqis subscribed to Stalin's statement that, "If you tell a lie often enough, it becomes the truth."

The End-Time Wars

3. Now, as the war in Iraq hopefully draws to an end, new questions arise. The world is a far different place than it was just a few weeks ago. The United Nations has defaulted on its promise to face tyranny as it rises, leaving that to Britain and the United States. Many supposed allies, who abandoned the U.S. in the war, now want to be included in the rebuilding

effort. Will it lead to a new world order? Could it possibly lead to Armageddon?

You can be assured that this is not the beginning of Armageddon. The battle of Armageddon will take place at the end of the 7-year tribulation period. . . well after the Antichrist has taken control of the world and subjected the world to the mark of the beast. By the time Armageddon rolls around, nearly half of the world's people will have died, and even more importantly to us, the Rapture will have already taken place long before Armageddon.

"War is such a terrible thing! Why does God allow it? Can't He just stop it and make it all go away?"

War is not new, nor is it peculiar to Planet Earth. War began long before Earth was created, and it began right in heaven, right in God's own house! The greatest being God had ever created, Lucifer the lightbearer, who hovered over the throne of God and orchestrated the heavenly choir, became puffed up with pride. He decided that he was doing all the work – not God – and therefore he deserved the praise of the heavenly host. So he set out to tear God from His throne. In so doing, Lucifer became Satan, the great adversary of God.

The Bible indicates that despite fond hopes, frenetic negotiations, preemptive strikes, disarmament, peace movements, and cowardly compromises, there still will come upon the world the final wars of history. Man's inhumanity to man will reach a climax that finally must bring divine intervention.

What are these wars? Let us first remember that every war is, in a sense, a prophetic war. Speaking about not merely the ending of time but about all times, Jesus said, "And

you shall hear of wars and rumors of wars: see that you be not troubled: for all these things must come to pass, but the end is not yet" (Matt. 24:6). So, despite every effort for peace, a constant state of war will prevail in history. The indication that we have from Christ is that nothing man will do will be able to change this constant danger of the sword coming upon the land.

Why is this the case? War in heaven is, of course, because man is a sinner, alienated from God. Having come short of the glory of God, he also comes short of his high ideals for a peaceful world. In the prophetic Word, God warns us of constant human animosity, and He tells us the inner reason for this, the sinful heart of man.

Special War

The Bible then teaches that there will be a specific war of awesome proportions come upon the world which will teach a lesson for all of the world to observe. That special war will be when "the Prince of Rosh" (Russia) and its allies move in an attempted conquest of the Middle East. Those allies are Persia, Turkey, Libya, Ethiopia, and possibly Germany. For a description of this frightful conflict, one need only read the pages of the Old Testament, Ezekiel chapters 38 and 39. In this war, Russia, that great king of the North, will think an evil thought. The bear will say, "I will go up to the land of unwalled villages" and will move to the South, anticipating easy conquest.

What will be the outcome of this invasion? God says that He will call for a sword against this invading army and will rain upon it the deadly missiles of hailstone, fire, and brimstone. So great will be the carnage that it will take seven months of labor to bury the dead and seven years to burn for fuel the wreckage of the battle.

What will be the result of this war? A jealous God says, "I will be known in the eyes of many nations, and they shall know that I am the Lord" (Ex. 38:23)

Believers in the West should note the details of this battle. They

will especially note that Israel is apparently without protection at the time of this invasion. The present human protection of the state of Israel is their friendship with the West and especially, America.

This battle will take place on or near the beginning of the period of time called "the Tribulation" and the end of the Church Age. The situation, therefore, in the Middle East, which could bring on this battle, ought therefore to cause us to be filled with anticipation of the Rapture of the Church. It is that time that the Lord Himself will descend from heaven and take up from the world every believing Christian. What a day that will be!

The Tribulation

This battle is then followed by a period of time called "the Tribulation," the end of which is called The Great Tribulation. In that short but deadly era, many wars will take place across the world. The result will be that, in the first round of things, one quarter of the population of the world will be killed with the sword, with hunger, with death, and with the beasts of the earth (Rev. 6:8).

This will be followed by another series of wars in which a third part of the remainder of men are killed (Rev. 9:18).

Finally, as The Tribulation draws to its close, the Antichrist will gather the nations of the world to make war against the Lord Himself. The Apostle John was given a vision of this awesome battle and finally informs us that the blood will flow to the level of the horses' bridles (Rev. 14:20).

In the process of describing these wars, the Scriptures give us accounts which can only be apparently fulfilled by a vast nuclear confrontation between certain nations. Chemical war may also be suggested in that many of the rivers of earth are poisoned as a consequence (Rev. 8:11). We can, therefore, be very sure that for anyone to move into the days of The Great Tribulation is not a prospect that should be anticipated with anything but cold fear. This because The Tribulation will be the time of the prophetic wars, fought with such intensity as to threaten the survival of earth and the stability of heaven.

Are we moving into the days of the prophetic wars? We should surely allow for that possibility because, different from any other time, certain signs are in place which are to indicate the time of the end. Note that:

- 1. Israel is back in the land (Ex. 37:21).
- 2. Jerusalem is back in Jewish hands (Luke 21:24).
- 3. Knowledge is being increased (Dan.12:4).
- 4. People are running everywhere (Dan.12:4).
- 5. Racial animosity is increasing (Matt.24:7).
- 6. Iniquity is growing (Matt. 24:12).
- 7. False messiahs are multiplying (Matt.24:24).
- 8. Apostasy is increasing (II Thess. 2:3).
- 9. Delusion grows in the world (II Thess. 2:11).

These and many other signs are multiplying in our time, becoming a backdrop which may indicate that coming upon us are the prophetic wars.

There remains then the question, "What shall I do?" The first answer is that I should become a Christian, a child of God. When I believe that Christ died for my sins and rose again, receiving Him I have life eternal.

Then, with equal earnestness, we invite every believing Christian to truly commit his time, talent, and treasure to the service of Christ. The world is looking for answers, and we need articulate believers who will bring that answer to our generation. An emphasis anew on the prophetic Word is a needed thing in the Church of our time. Then, let's stay with it, let's keep it up. Jesus said, "And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall grow cold" (Matt.24:12). How tragic! Many will run well, but in the last moment will fail to all that God wants them to be. Don't let this happen to you!

THE TIDE OF OUR TIMES

THE EUROPEAN UNION will soon be adding 10 more nations with over 75 million citizens bringing its total membership to 25 with a population of over 450 million. "If all goes to plan, Cyprus, the Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Slovakia, and Solvenia will become part of the EU family in only 17 months time. With their accession, the EU will reach the vaguely defined border lands of old Europe."

But, concerning future admissions, there are differing opinions as to which countries should be allowed and whether or not those outside of "traditional" Europe should be allowed to join at all, with some saying that Turkey, Russia, and the Ukraine should definitely not be allowed in. Turkey is especially troublesome in their eyes due to its Muslim majority.

British sources point out, though, that "Turkey's history. . . is inseparable from Europe's whether one looks back to the ancient Greeks or to the subsequent Rome, Byzantine, and Ottoman Empires." "The Romans, who ruled Europe for centuries, called the Mediterranean 'our sea' and there is no reason to think any differently now."

So with the possible inclusion of North African nations in the not-to-distant future, one can see a revived Roman Empire definitely taking shape.

Y OUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED



Q. Why is the world so bad?

A. You are correct in pointing up the wickedness of this world. A brief consideration

of Romans 3 gives us a list of the awful, godless attitudes of men. Romans 1 tells us that the world, because of its wickedness, has been given up by God. It has been abandoned to uncleanness, vile affections and a reprobate mind. So, the world is a bad place because men choose sin and lawlessness rather than God and order

No amount of human effort will ever change this dreadful situation until people turn to Christ for forgiveness and salvation.

Because the Bible says, "Evil men and seducers shall become worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived" (II Tim. 3:13). We should not place our confidence in the future of earth. The idea that man's effort will produce a perfect world is nonsense. If you hope for a perfect world, set your affections on things above and look for the return of Christ.

Q. Why does not God intervene in our deteriorating culture?

A. God has intervened powerfully in the death, burial, and resurrection of Christ. The sacrifice of the Son of God has produced a marvelous message called, "the Gospel." Every time you preach or testify of the Gospel

you are an instrument of divine intervention in the decline of humanity and the rise of human wickedness. You are an instrument of divine intervention by announcing the Gospel. God will, however, intervene personally at the end of this age. The Second Coming of Christ is a certainty. In the meantime, God allows the world to continue because He is not willing that any should perish. He keeps open the doors of love, awaiting the last person who will enter into the ark of safety.

Q. How much of the Tribulation will Christians see?

A. We will see all of it, but not on a horizontal level. We will view the activities of earth from the vantage point of heaven. This is because, before the Tribulation, the Church will have been taken via The Rapture into the glories of heaven. Yes, the Church will be delivered from the Tribulation by the wonderful event of the pretribulation Rapture.

Q. Will we know one another in heaven?

A. Yes, certainly. "Then shall I know even as also I am known" (I Cor. 13:12). Apart from this we would not understand heaven. One aspect of heaven will be a wonderful, heart-touching reunion with loved ones who have gone before

Q. How much should Christians be involved in political, human activism?

A. Jesus told us that we are the salt of the earth and, therefore, a degree of involvement is proper. We are not wise to drown in the political structure, but work for the preservation of our spiritual opportunity. We cannot, and will not, save the world, but we can press governments to continually allow the preaching of the Gospel. The Bible often warns the rulers of this world concerning their morality and activities. We should be the custodians of that warning.

Q. In heaven, will we remember the things of earth?

A. Again, of course. Heaven would not be heaven unless we remembered the lesser world and how we got from earth to heaven. The believers in heaven can certainly know and understand the events of earth. However, it is likely that we will be so interested in examining our mansion there that we will not spend too much time remembering the tar-paper shacks of earth. We must remember that we are allowed to endure the troubles of time so that we can be properly grateful for heaven. The degree of difficulty which we have in this world is evidence of the level of total joy that we will experience in the world to come.

Q. How can I know that I am saved?

A. Do you believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God and that He died for your sins on the cross? If so, you are saved.

THINKING TOGETHER

OBJECT AND OBJECTIVE

We have, as our readers will remember, extended in these pages an earnest call for Christian thinking. The core of the difficulties which our world now faces is the absence of anything that resembles The Christian View in the modern mind, in the thinking of our society. In our view, the absence of correct thought can be ascribed to the fact that most people, in what passes for thinking today, allow their thoughts to center on the wrong objects and to contemplate the wrong objectives. In short, our world mostly thinks about the wrong things for the wrong reasons and as a result, something between intellectual poverty and strange insanity has come upon the culture of our time.

This being the case, what then should be the object of our thinking? The Apostle Paul, that great intellectual of the New Testament, had the answer. Finally, brethren, whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things" (Phil. 4:8).

These are to be the objects of our thinking even while we live in a world which is filled with lies and lechery. The degeneration of our present corrupt culture need not subvert our minds. Not, that is, if we will deliberately concentrate on that list of the imperative things that make for sanity and stability.

Think again of those objects. We are to think about. . .

- 1. Things that are true. There is no doubt that most of the touted "principles" of our time are simple, straightforward unvarnished lies. Men have even changed the truth of God into a lie (Rom. 1:25), and as a result, that which is false sounds more true than that which is true.
- 2. Things that are honest. Quite obviously, most of the problems of our world--from troubled marriages to economic collapse (these often go together)--come because of the dishonest thinking of people. Our world has, therefore, come to live in a house of delusions in its frantic attempt to escape reality. Dishonesty now warps the world from pole to pole.
- **3.** Things that are just. Even in a distorted world, people should be given what they deserve, paid what they have earned. It is unjust to ask the competent to support the incompetent, or the resolute to forever compensate for the unreliable.
- **4.** Things that are pure. It takes but a small fraction of impurity in a glass of pure water to render drinking water unsafe or even fatal. Inner purity is far more valuable than outer beauty.
- **5.** Things that are lovely. So many of the productions of our world are gross, degenerate, intrinsically ugly. What a contrast is a lovely life or even a genuinely attractive work of art.

- 6. Things that are of good report. Everything and every person has a reputation. A good reputation is easily the greatest personal credential one can have. We all need to live lives that are well-reported so that others may be encouraged.
- 7. Things that are virtuous. Unquestionably, the basis of life is moral. Neither morality, nor fame, nor cleverness can make up for the absence of virtue. So it is that the first call to the Christian is to "add to your faith virtue" (II Peter 1:5).
- 8. Things that are praiseworthy. The mind must be forced to think upwardly, inhabiting a higher level. That which is shoddy and superficial must not be praised, except in the case of children whom we wish to damage. We to congratulate the commendable and give honor to whom honor is due. The moral inversion of our time too often means that the degenerate is praised (albeit often posthumously in that he has died of AIDS) and the honorable man languishes in a jail cell.

These things should be the object of our contemplations. Yes, there are still godly people, selfless activities, and great truths for us to contemplate and then emulate.

By contrast, how inexpressibly sad it is that our society is so strongly influenced by cultured reprobates who, in the name of "academic freedom,"

"civil rights," "freedom of choice," and "freedom of artistic expression," have so offended the soul of our beloved nation. Obviously, our society must find a way to keep degenerates out of positions of influence and wicked carnalists from the levers of power. Failing this, our society will become incurably wicked, thereby guaranteeing its own selfdestruction or untold ruin under the mighty hand of a holy God. Soon to expire is the nation which suffers sodomites to serve in its Congress or pedophiles in its religious leadership.

An antidote to this is suggested in the Scripture. "Those things, which you have both learned, and received, and heard, and seen in me. do: and the God of peace shall be with you" (Phil. 4:9). Here is a clear call for Christian influence. Christians. having learned and received the higher truth, the pure Word of God, are supposed to do it. The Christian is the workmanship of God and he is called to good works, earnest endeavors, magnificent accomplishments for the Lord in this world.

America, in our judgment, is in a condition where nothing short of powerful moral reversal will preserve us as a nation. In that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God, that moral reversal must be based on spiritual life, yes, the revival of spiritual life. The pure water of divine revelation must be poured again into the parched earth of today's wicked society. Perhaps then God anew will visit us with spiritual revival, with showers of blessing.

Learn again the formula

given to us by the Word of God. The *object* of our contemplation are the pure things given to us in the Word of God. The *objective* of that contemplation must be earnest endeavor for the Lord, the doing of those virtues which are ours because of Christ.

A final reminder is also appropriate. Those virtues must be done out in the world. Happily do we meet in beautiful churches behind stained glass windows to hear messages appropriate to the season. Unhappily, so little is translated out into a cynical, preoccupied, increasingly wicked world. Too seldom does the Christian stand in a political meeting, in a self-discovery seminar, in a worldly study group demand honesty and scholarship from the subversive Too seldom is the speaker. Christian view the ready resource of the believer, and too rare is the ability to make that Christian

view stick in a cynical world. So it is that the pure religion of Christianity, the honest answers which it brings to every question, the proper judgment and pure motive which it embodies—too seldom are these applied with impact to a society. The result is that the world simply does not think of the Christian faith as a valid part of the equation of life, a serious factor to be considered.

But isn't this to be the objective of our thinking, our contemplation, our labors? Much has now been considered within the halls of our churches. Much now must be done in a world that knows little of the Gospel of Christ. It is time to turn the potential into the kinetic.
